### **"DIABETES AWARENESS ESSAY"**

**Contest Rules 2017-18**

#### **"ACCEPTING A DIABETES DIAGNOSIS: WHAT CAN PARENTS, PARTNERS AND CARETAKERS DO TO HELP LOVE ONES ADJUST TO A NEW NORMAL?"**

##### 1. Essay Subject

" Some individuals diagnosed with diabetes have a difficult time accepting a diabetes diagnosis and fail to seek medical attention for this disease. What specific recommendations can you provide for parents, partners, family members and caretakers to help love ones adjust to living with diabetes and help them live long and healthy lives.

##### 2. Contest Rules

- A. The Title of the Contestant's essay is not required to be the same as the Subject for the essay. Contestants should be creative in the selection of an essay title and set the tone for their presentation with the title they choose.
- B. The essay should analyze the problem given in the subject and present a solution or solutions to the problem.
- C. The topic is broad and allows the contestants considerable leeway in the selection of their solution or solutions.
- D. Creative, innovative, practical and reasonable ideas are welcome.
- E. Each Contestant shall personally research, write and read his/her contest essay.
- F. Research for this topic can be conducted by interviewing physicians, nurses, medical professionals, community and organization works, etc., and by using the internet and library. The essay shall be a written article, to be read by the Contestant, to be judged by a panel of judges in competition with other contestants.
- G. The essay shall not exceed 1500 words.
  - i. All words in the essay are counted including articles, conjunctives and pronouns. Examples: "I," "a," "the," "and" and "an."
  - ii. The essay must include a bibliography of alphabetized sources used in its composition.  
Note: the bibliography is not included in the 1500 word count.
  - iii. Essay should be typed in double space format.
- H. The following criteria shall be used for judging the essays:
  - i. Sixty percent (60%) of the score shall be based on the authenticity, current information and an application of the assigned essay topic.
  - ii. Twenty-five percent (25%) of the score shall be based on the understandability of the essay through personal presentation techniques, in the use of posture, eye contact and voice by its modulation, volume, speed and clarity.
  - iii. Fifteen percent (15%) of the score shall be based on grammar, spelling, sentence structure, pronunciation, enunciation, correct word usage, and relationship to the assigned essay topic.
- I. Video equipment may not be used in contests.
- J. Two or more of the judges should be knowledgeable about the medical aspect of diabetes.
- K. One of the judges should be an educator knowledgeable about the English language, its grammar, sentence structure, pronunciation and correct usage.

- L. All contests shall be conducted in the English language and contestants, during contest presentations, shall speak English.
- M. The contest area must have good acoustics, be free from outside noises and disturbances, and have controlled access.
- N. Order of appearance before the judging panel will be determined in advance at the direction of the State OFY Chair.
- O. Contestants shall remain outside the contest area until invited to enter by the Contest Official.
- P. The audience will be informed before the first contestant not to applaud at the end of the speech and reminded before each contestant delivers his/her speech of the same requirement.
- Q. The audience will be asked to turn off any cell phones and/or electronic devices during the contest time. Failure to comply with this rule could result in disqualification of a Contestant at the discretion of the Contest Official.
- R. Contestants will not give any self-introduction but shall state the title of their essay and then deliver the essay.
- S. No one will be allowed either to enter or leave the contest area during the presentation of a contestant's essay.
- T. After each essay the audience will be asked to leave the contest area at the end of each speech to allow judges time to score the essays based on contest criteria.
- U. The winners will be announced on the same day of the contest.

### 3. Awards

- The 1<sup>st</sup> place winner will receive \$1000.00 scholarship.
- The 2nd place winner will receive \$500.00 scholarship.
- To collect the scholarship award, the contestant must complete the following process:
  - i. Contestant winner must submit the Scholarship Request Form along with proof of registration from the school or university.
  - ii. Submit the form along with supplemental documentations to District Chairperson by mail to:

4. Payment will be made directly to the designated school.

5. The scholarship awards must be collected no later than two years following the recipient's graduation from High School.

6. Rules of Eligibility for contestants:

- a. A club may sponsor no more than one Contestant in each contest by submitting a completed entry application (containing all requested signatures), associated documents, and the entry fee to the District Contest Coordinator prior to the entry deadline.
- b. A false statement on the entry application, or associated document, causes disqualification of the Contestant, with the entry fee being forfeited.
- c. There shall be no refund of any entry fee.
- d. Each contestant must be or have been a regularly enrolled student in a public high school or comparable educational program, located in Texas.
- f. Each contestant must be a high school senior
- g. Contestants shall not have been married, had a marriage annulled, cohabited with a person of the opposite sex who is unrelated to the Contestant or who has participated in the conception of a child before participation in the contest.

## 7. Responsibilities of Contestants

- a. Each Contestant shall be required to submit the following to their sponsoring Lions Club and/or District.
  - i. **State Contest Application (mandatory to be completed online and copied; no handwritten applications will be accepted).**
  - ii. **Two (2) high quality wallet/passport photographs (such as current school picture) that are of the head-and-shoulders, glossy and in color.**
  - iii. **Signed Copy of the Code of Conduct and Chaperone Guidelines**
  - iv. **Medical Power of Attorney** designating his/her Chaperone as the Primary Responsible Party and the State Contest Chair as the Secondary Responsible Party.
  - v. **Four (4) Typed Copies of the Essay, including Bibliography.**

All contestants must agree to be available, upon request to participate in Lions District 2-S2 events and activities during the period from immediately after the contest until the end of the following year's contest.

## 8. Responsibilities of the Sponsoring Club

- a. An entry fee of \$100 to be attached to each participant's application. Check to be payable to **District 2S2**
- b. The sponsoring club must make sure all documents listed above (Items 7 (a)(i-v) are completed, have all required signatures and are sent to the District Chairperson. **The deadline to postmark all applications will be March 31, 2018**
