

Lions Service Project Houston Cy-Fair LIONS helping BEARS (Be a Resource for CPS Kids) OH MY!

To assist children currently in or going into Child Protective Services, there is a severe need for various items to meet a child's immediate needs.

Service Project: Hold a one day "Spring Clean" community donation event where we collect items for children in, moving around in or going into foster care.

We would be collecting:

- Carry-on, small size duffle bags, suitcases, totes, backpacks. Together we can ensure children have more than just a plastic bag.
- Travel size/small size/full size toiletries; shampoo, conditions, toothbrushes, toothpaste, soaps
- New Clothing, Shoes, Pajamas, Diapers
- New Toys, Stuffed Animals, Blankets
- Full detailed list 2nd page

With LIONS helping BEARS, we can provide hope and help for abused and neglected children and the case workers who protect them within Harris County.

All donations will be delivered to a BEAR room. These BEAR rooms are emergency supply rooms for abused and neglected children in Harris County. Often times children are brought into CPS care with soiled clothing and no belongings. BEAR rooms are there to respond to those needs. The BEAR staff works to ensure that each room is fully stocked with formula, diapers, shoes, clothing, snacks, toys and stuffed animals to meet a child's immediate needs.

Needs List from BEAR:

- Unused Hygiene Packs (which include 2-in-1 shampoo, conditioner, bars of soap, individual toothbrushes and toothpaste and deodorant.
- Unused Hair care products (lice shampoo, hair ties, and hair brush/comb)
- New Baby Hygiene Packs (which include baby wash, baby lotion, baby powder, and diaper rash ointment – should you want to assemble your own!) Per the staff at BEAR, they would be thrilled to have the small Hotel bottles of shampoo, conditioner, soap, etc.
- Baby wipes
- Formula (all types)
- New Diapers (NB size 6)
- Baby items (pacifier, bib, receiving blanket, and 'sippy' cup)
- New Clothing of all sizes (NB juniors)
- New Pajamas of all sizes (NB juniors)
- New Socks of all sizes (NB juniors)
- New Shoes of all sizes
- New Underwear of all sizes (child adult)
- Stuffed animals
- Toys (not board games)

- Books
- Blankets
- Duffle bags/overnight bags *Children sometimes have to use trash-bags to hold their items. Together, we can make sure they have more than just a plastic bag.
- Household cleaning supplies (Lysol wipes, all-in-one cleaning solution, mops, broom & dustpan set, Fabuloso, laundry detergent, dish-soap, and paper towels)
- NOTES: If donating bags, please no bags larger than carry-on/overhead bin size. If the bag has a zipper, the zipper must work. All clothing should be new, clan, untorn, unstained and ready to wear. All toiletries must be unopened/unused.

BEAR is a 501(C)3 public/private partnership that provides emergency goods and services directly to children under the care of Children's Protective Service (CPS) in Harris Count. Thanks to the contributions last year, 12,000 abused children received new items from BEAR necessities, include shoes, school uniforms, replacement clothes, diaper, car seats, hygiene items and other essentials.
